





Program Description Nursing Assistant is designed to prepare high school students for entry-level employment in nursing homes, hospitals, doctors' offices, or clinics. Clinical experiences are provided in a variety of in-patient and out-patient settings. Students enrolled in the program rotate through health care facilities. Nursing students work directly with patients, nurses, physicians, and other health care professionals and receive hands-on experience in all major specialty areas in community agencies, long-term care facilities, and hospitals.

Completion of the nursing curriculum and general education degree requirements prepares students to take the national licensure exam and apply for Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA). Certification requirements are the exclusive responsibility of the State Board of Nursing. The program is consistent with the Arizona State Board of Nursing as well as current state and national school nurse standards and guidelines under the direction of Eastern Arizona College.
